

Transportation Risks Emergency instructions

In case of adverse weather conditions

- 1. The rules of the road are made with the goal of safety in mind. The most important parts of safe travel are prudence and common sense.
- 2. Make sure you have enough fuel to deal with any long stretches without a gas station. Not having enough can lead to a dangerous situation.
- 3. With a lot of rain, snow, or fog, the roads can go from bad to worse. Remember that your first goal is to get to your destination without harming yourself or others.
- 4. If you are traveling with children or elderly or sick people, make sure you have whatever they need to be comfortable because they have special needs.
- 5. Be advised of weather and traffic conditions by listening to the radio. The conditions of the road are constantly changing.
- 6. Have useful numbers for information and/or rescue. Sometimes you are in need of immediate help.
- 7. Unless absolutely necessary, postpone leaving until poor weather or traffic conditions have been resolved. It is better to not unnecessarily risk anything.
- 8. Make sure children are seated properly and have their seatbelts fastened. Their safety depends on your attention.
- 9. If there is a lot of snow, do not use your car if you have not installed chains or snow tires. The risk of losing control of the car is very high.
- 10. Keep animals in an enclosed space. In case of a crash, their behavior is unpredictable and dangerous.
