## Objectives

- increase safety of women and children victims by promoting a coordinated multi-agency response to male perpetrators

- build capacity of frontline professionals (FPs) to address and refer perpetrators

- improve coordination between frontline services and perpetrator programmes

## Activities

- conduct qualitative interviews/focus groups on service needs and referral pathways with perpetrators, FPs and perpetrator programme experts; develop ENGAGE Roadmap and training for FPs; implement & evaluate Roadmap for 6 months in 4 partner countries; provide EC with policy recommendations; disseminate Roadmap through partners, EU networks, UNFPA & WWP-EN

# Type and number of persons benefiting from the project

- FPs (social, health and child protection services, police, etc.) to provide improved response and referrals (200; 50 per country); GBV advocates at UNFPA events (500) and experts at WWP EN events (80)

- Male perpetrators receiving improved frontline service response and referrals (estimated 4,000; 1,000 per country; 20 perpetrators per FP during project); Partners and children victims through increased safety by perpetrators receiving coordinated support (estimated 8,000; 2,000 per country; 1 partner &s 1 child per perpetrator)

### **Expected results**

- 25% increase in FPs referrals to perpetrator programmes; improbe knowledge and abilities of FPs to provide coordinated multi-agency response to perpetrators; improved safety of women and children victims; awareness of the ENGAGE Roadmap at EU level

### Type and number of outputs to be produced

- 8 multi-agency focus groups, 20-40 perpetrator interviews, 20 expert interviews, 1 guideline on focus group/interview; 1 ENGAGE Roadmap; 1 Training Package; 4-6 Training workshops per country (8h with 10-20 participants each); 1 adapted PREMIS questionnaire; 1 Evaluation report; 1 webpage, 4 national + 1 WWP EN Dissemination Plans; 1 'Policy Recommendations to EU'; 1 project summary; 2 project reports; 2 Advisory Board reports
